

## NPT country information – Indonesia

### Identification of sectors and projects

In June 2004, the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs added Indonesia to the list of NPT countries. However, the real start was made in February 2005, when the presidential elections were concluded and the new government was in place.

In February 2005, the Royal Netherlands Embassy (RNE) and Nuffic agreed that:

- Due to Indonesia's size and the large number of institutions, a simplified identification process would be followed, without sector analysis or stakeholder meetings.
- Institutions would be selected by RNE, in close consultation with the Indonesian authorities.
- Projects would have to follow the multi-year (bilateral) cooperation strategy of RNE (see website) and be in line with Indonesian government policies.
- Institutions would preferably have to have some history of cooperation with the Netherlands.

In March 2005, five institutions were selected and invited by Nuffic to write project outlines. In June and July 2005 this led to four calls for tender. One of these had to be re-tendered in November 2005.

Three more institutions were invited in 2006 to write project outlines, leading to 2 calls for tender in the same year.

Thus far, three projects started on 1 January 2006, and one each on 1 May, 1 September and 1 December 2006. There are 2 projects in the pipeline to be tendered in 2007.

NPT activities in Indonesia have the official support of:

- Directorate-General for Higher Education (DGHE), Ministry of National Education (MoNE).
- Directorate-General for Islamic Institutions (DGII), Ministry of Religious Affairs (MoRA).
- Ministry of Science and Technology (RISTEK), albeit indirectly.
